Under announcements and recognitions, Dr. Robert Barron presented The Extra Mile Award to Joe Stover, Technology Teacher at North Habersham Middle School. Tracy Allison made the nomination and in her nomination states:

I would like to nominate Mr. Joe Stover, a technology teacher at NHMS, for having a servant's heart for the Extra Mile Award. He often goes out of his way to help others, but I wanted to share a specific incident in which he was a good Samaritan.

On November 7<sup>th</sup> we had two home basketball games, which ran fairly late. Afterwards, the weather was very damp and very cold. Pretty much everyone was gone from the game/school except for the custodians, Mr. Stover, and me. Unknowing to me, a parent of the opposing team had a flat tire and was broken down in our upper parking lot. Mr. Stover who was not required to stay for either of the basketball games but did, noticed and went out to help him. Mr. Stover waited with the man's truck until that parent from the other team could leave and go get special tools, etc. to fix the flat tire, break down, etc. It took almost an hour for the man to get back to North Habersham, as there's not too many places open at that time of night especially in the Northern part of the county. Mr. Stover who was wearing a very thin jacket patiently waited outside and spent almost another hour on the ground trying to help the man use a special jack to get the spare tire from up under the truck to come down. Despite their best efforts, they couldn't get it to work. During this entire time, Mr. Stover continued to work with a man he had no clue who he was and kept telling me that there was no reason for me to stay too as he had things under control and he would lock everything up himself. Finally, some time after 9:00 pm the

man from the other team gave up because they couldn't get it to work. The man left his truck there and had it towed the next morning. Only then did Mr. Stover feel like he could leave.

In addition to teaching technology and traveling between two middle schools, Mr. Stover who also has leadership certification, assists the administration at NHMS by spending much time during his planning or after school watching bus videos and documenting events/times which immensely helps the administrators by knowing exactly where to look on videos for discipline issues.

Mr. Stover keeps abreast of the latest in technology and readily collaborates and shares his knowledge with other teachers in our building.

Not only does Mr. Stover work as a teacher, he is an important part of our school safety team. His EMT and volunteer fireman background is a great asset to our school. Many times he will come to school after having been out all night assisting with a fire somewhere in the community. As a result, he recently used his connections to set up fire extinguisher training for our school.

He routinely thinks of and share ways that we can make improvements at our school. He currently serves as the team leader for our connections teachers.

These are just a few of the reasons why I nominated Mr. Stover for the Extra Mile Award.

Without being asked to do so, Mrs. Chambers retrieved each trash bag from the dumpster to begin her search. After opening each trash bag and digging for the retainer, Mrs. Chambers found the retainer in the very last bag at the bottom of the dumpster.

By taking the initiative to selflessly dig through the garbage to retrieve a student's retainer, Mrs. Chamber exemplified what it means put service above self.
